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# **Introduction**



## Key words

<b>Term</b>	<b>Description</b>
<b>Author</b>	The person, group or organization that created the source. There may be single or multiple authors; or single or multiple editors; or organizations may be credited as authors rather than specific individuals. If the source has no designated author you may use the title in place of the author. Can be found on the first page of the article.
<b>Bibliography</b>	A complete list of all sources consulted when preparing a piece of work, whether cited in-text or not. It records the full publication details of each source in the same way as for a reference list. Use a bibliography only if specifically requested to do so.
<b>Copy or reproduce</b>	<p>Inserting an image, figure or table from a source in your own work without modifying it in any way. If you reproduce a table in your work, you should label it as a table and include a citation. Tables should be numbered sequentially with a title above and citation below. If you include data, or some columns of data, from a table in your work, you also need to include a citation.</p> <p>If an image, diagram or visual in is included in the text, is referred to as a Figure or a Table, which should be numbered sequentially, e.g. Figure 1 or Table 1. These are called labels. The source of the image, figure or table should be typed under the label.</p>
<b>E-book</b>	An eBook is an electronic version of a print book that can be downloaded and read on a computer or other digital device. However, printed copies may not exist and the eBook may be the only version of the text. A complete book or chapters of the eBook could be found. Some of these are free and other must be bought from publishers.

<b>In text citation or in-text reference</b>	<p>This is a reference to other people's work given in parenthesis (round brackets) in the sentence (in-text). It is a record of the author, date and sometimes page number of any sources that are used. Use surnames for in-text citations (no initials). The position of the in-text reference varies depending on where the author prominent or information prominent citations are used.</p> <p>An essay with few or no citations will be a cause of concern for lecturers as this may indicate plagiarism or limited research.</p>
<b>Paraphrase</b>	<p>Paraphrasing is putting someone else's ideas into your own words. When you paraphrase, you must provide an in-text reference to show that the material comes from another source.</p>
<b>Quotation</b>	<p>A direct quotation is the exact reproduction of someone's words, which is marked with quotation marks or other special formatting. It requires a citation.</p>
<b>Reference list</b>	<p>The complete list of all sources cited or quoted in the text of the work. The reference list appears at the end of the work. It records the full publication details of each source and is arranged in alphabetical order.</p> <p>Every in-text reference should appear in the reference list, and every item in the reference list should be mentioned at least once in the assignment. Additionally, the references that appear in the text must have the same spellings and dates as the ones in the reference list.</p>
<b>Source</b>	<p>The place where the information was found. Source type refers to whether the source is a book, article, website etc. and whether it is print or electronic. Referencing rules differ for each source type.</p>
<b>Volume number</b>	<p>The volume number indicates the total number of years a particular journal has been published-one volume per year. Is usually noted on the front cover or title page of the journal.</p>

<b>Issue number</b>	Refers to how many times that periodical have been published during that year. The issue number can usually be found either on the front cover or title page. Sometimes the issue number is also found on the first page of the article.
<b>Year of publication</b>	Refers to the year that the article has been published. Is almost always included on the front cover of the journal, or on the journal's title page. Often the publication year can also be found on the first page of each article, at the top of each page.
<b>URL</b>	This is the abbreviation for Uniform Resource Locator. It also known as the web address. When including a URL for a source found on the web it is not necessary to include a long URL if the website has a search engine.
<b>Journal</b>	A regularly published collection of articles that focus on topics specific to a particular academic discipline or profession. Journals might be published monthly, bi-monthly, quarterly, semi-annually, or even annually. Probably the most common publication frequency is monthly and quarterly. Journal articles are typically of substantial length (often more than 10 pages) and usually reflect research, whether it is surveys of existing research or discussions of original research.
<b>Article</b>	Much shorter than a book, an article can be as short as a paragraph or two or as long as several dozen pages. Articles can address any topic that the author decides to explore and can reflect opinion, news, research, reviews, instruction, nearly any focus. Articles appear in newspapers, magazines, trade publication, journals, and even in books. Because of their relative brevity, articles typically are used to provide up-to-date information on a wide variety of topics.
<b>Magazine</b>	A regularly published collection of articles that might focus on any topic in general or on topics of interest to a specific group. Magazines might be published weekly, monthly, semi-monthly or only several times a year. More commonly, magazines are published weekly or monthly. Articles in magazines are typically written for the general reading public and don't reflect in-depth research (an exception might be an investigative report written in a news magazine that involved weeks or months of research and interviews to complete). Most magazine articles do not list references

	and are written by the magazine's own staff writers. In general, magazine articles are easy to read, are fairly brief in length, and may include illustrations or photographs.
<b>Newspaper</b>	A regularly published collection of fairly brief articles that provide updates on current events and interests. Newspapers are generally published daily, weekly, and bi-weekly, although they may have less regular publication schedules.. Newspaper articles are written largely by newspaper staff and editors and often do not provide authors' names.

### **WHAT IS REFERENCING?**

It is a method used to demonstrate to your readers that you have conducted a thorough and appropriate literature search, and reading. Equally, referencing is an acknowledgement that you have used the ideas and written material belonging to other authors in your own work.

As with all referencing styles, there are two parts: citing, and the reference list.

### **WHY SHOULD I REFERENCE?**

Referencing is crucial to you to carry out successful research, and crucial to your readers so they can see how you did your research. Knowing why you need to reference means you will understand why it is important that you know how to reference.

- Accurate referencing is a key component of good academic practice and enhances the presentation of your work: it shows that your writing is based on knowledge and informed by appropriate academic reading.
- You will ensure that anyone reading your work can trace the sources you have used in the development of your work, and give you credit for your research efforts and quality.
- If you do not acknowledge another person's work or ideas, you could be accused of plagiarism.

## **WHAT SHOULD I REFERENCE?**

You should include a reference for all the sources of information that you use when writing or creating a piece of your own work.

## **WHAT IS A CITATION?**

When you use another person's work in your own work, either by referring to their ideas, or by including a direct quotation, you must acknowledge this in the text of your work. This acknowledgement is called a citation.

**Chapter - One**  
**Harvard-Style Referencing Guidelines**

## GENERAL GUIDELINES

The main aim in providing accurate and consistent referencing (apart from meeting academic conventions) is to enable your readers to look up the exact sources that you have cited in your piece of work. This means that you need to give accurate information about the type of item, the name or title of the item, who produced it, the date it was produced and where you found it.

The Harvard Style is an author-date style. Each reference is indicated in the text by the author and date of the publication, sometimes with added information such as page numbers.

- Your references should appear at the end of your essay/report with entries listed alphabetically by author (or by title if there is no author).
- Before you write your list of references/bibliography check with your lecturer/tutor for the bibliographic style they prefer.
- An ampersand (&) is used to connect authors' names within brackets, but not when they appear as part of a sentence.
- When using a direct quote from the text, or paraphrasing a specific section of the text, you must include page numbers (where available) in your in text citation
- "Direct quotations are placed in double quotations marks" (Author's Surname, Year of Publication, p. – followed by page number – in brackets).

"This theory is supported by recent work" (Brown, 1999, p. 25).

Bloggs talks about "the importance of preparation" for interviews (2007, p. 57).

- When citing in text more than one publication at a time it is recommended that the authors' names be ordered alphabetically inside the brackets. Use a semicolon (;) to separate the works cited inside the brackets.

For four or more authors, et al. (meaning "and others") may be used in place of additional

(Jones et al., 2006).

But all the names must be written in the reference citation list

Jones, R., Andrew, T. and MacColl, J. (2006) *The Institutional Repository*, Oxford, Chandos Publishing.

- When two or more references by the same author in the same year are used, letters should be used in the in text citation and reference list to indicate which publication is being referred to, e.g. (Smith 2010a; Smith 2010b).
- Where you have several in-text citations together, you should order them in reverse chronological order, beginning with the most recently published source, and separate each source with a semicolon (;). If more than one work is published in the same year, order these texts alphabetically by author.

(Frobisher, 2012; Barnes et al., 2009; Huy, 2009; Monk and Bosco, 2001)

- p. indicates only one page and pp. indicates a range of pages.
- Use (Accessed:...) when you have simply viewed the source on the internet, whereas use (Downloaded:...) when you have specifically downloaded something, for example a book onto your computer.
- In-text citations enable you to indicate in your work where you have used ideas or material from other sources. Here are some examples using the Harvard style. If, for example, your source is a book written by Brown and published in 1999, your in-text references would follow one of these three formats:

Further work (Brown, 1999) supports this claim

Further work by Brown (1999) supports this claim

'This theory is supported by recent work' (Brown, 1999, p. 25).



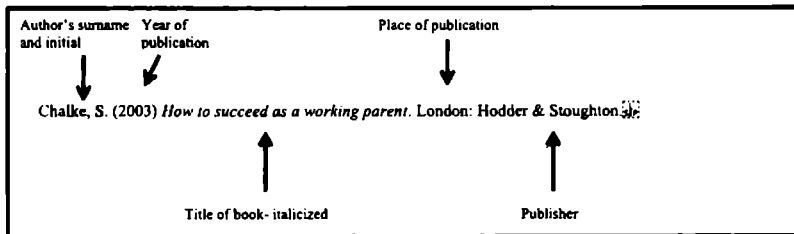
## Book/ Print

For a book, the following elements should be presented in this order:

- Author's surname (family name) and initials.
- (Year of publication)
- Title of book in italics and minimal capitalization.
- The edition, if not the original publication; for example, 4th edition.
- Publisher:
- Place of publication.

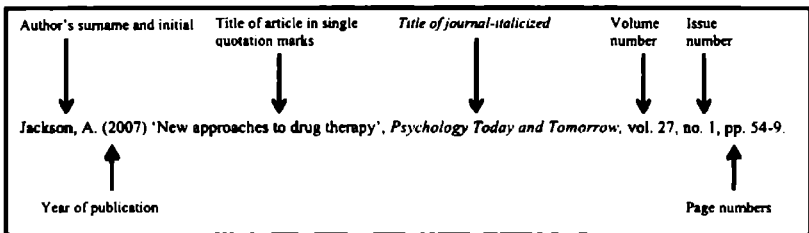
When including a journal article in the reference list, the following elements should be presented in this order:

- **Author(s) surname (family name), initial(s).**
- **(Year of publication)**
- **'Title of article in single quotation marks and minimal capitalization',**
- **Title of journal or periodical in italics and maximal capitalization,**
- **Volume number.**
- **Issue number.**
- **Page numbers on which the article begins and ends.**

### **American Psychiatric Association (APA) - Style Referencing Guidelines**

## **In text citations – APA**

Referencing is an essential part of academic writing. Spending time learning how to reference your assignments accurately will help you:

- **Maximize the marks available to you for referencing.**
- **Fulfill the assessment requirements set out in your Unit Outline.**
- **Avoid allegations of plagiarism.**
- **Comply with the Academic Honesty Policy.**

## **Two essential parts of APA referencing**

- **In text citations** show where in your assignment you have referred to information from your research through the use of paraphrases and quotations.
- **The list of references** contains full bibliographic information for each of the sources cited in your assignment.

## **Two ways of citing information**

- **Paraphrases** are the ideas from your research put into your own words. For paraphrases, use the author's surname and year of publication. The 6<sup>th</sup> edition of the *APA Publication Manual* encourages writers also to include the page number for paraphrases when it would help a reader to locate the information in a long or complex text.
- **Quotations** are the exact words from the original source. For quotations, use the author's surname, year of publication and page number or paragraph number (for some electronic sources). You will also need to enclose the quoted information in quotation marks.

### **Paraphrase examples**

- Thompson and Smith (2003) concluded from their research that people's attitudes towards capital punishment are largely based on emotion.
- Managers spend most of their time on communication issues (Brown, 2005).
- Another study has examined the effects of communication in nursing management decision making (National Association for Health, 2006).

### **Quotation examples**

- Smith (2003) states, "managers need a detailed understanding of the communication process to be effective in the workplace" (p. 12).
- Managers need a detailed understanding of the communication process to be effective in the workplace" (Smith, 2003, p. 12).
- Basu and Jones (2007) went so far as to suggest the need for a new "intellectual framework in which to consider the nature and form of regulation in cyberspace" (para. 4).

### **Multiple authors (In- text citation)**

For 3 to 5 authors of the one-book/journal article cited in text:

- Cite all authors the first time.
- After that, only cite the surname of the first author followed by "et al."
- For 6 or more authors cite the surname of the first author followed by et al. for the first and subsequent citations.

### **Examples of multiple authors in text citation**

- An important measure of whether a patient has received quality care can be demonstrated by patient satisfaction (Johansson, Oleni & Fridlund, 2002).
- Further research is also required on the reasons for patient dissatisfaction (Johansson et al., 2002).

### **Citations taken from secondary sources**

- When citing a source that appears within the source you are reading, include the surname of the author cited, followed by the surname and year of publication of the source you are reading.

### **Examples of secondary source citation**

- Bion (as cited in Gibb, 2008) noted that most groups aim to be functional but sometimes underlying assumptions interfere with this aim.
- Most groups aim to be functional but sometimes underlying assumptions interfere with this aim (Bion, as cited in Gibb, 2008).

**NOTE:** The entry in your list of references will only include the source you are reading, Gibb, as this is the source you have accessed, not the original work by Bion.

### **Long quotations (40 words or more)**

When citing long quotations in research or assignments:

- Start on a new line and use double line spacing.
- Indent 5 spaces from the left margin.
- Do not use quotation marks.
- Include the citation at the end of quotation, after the full stop. ~~Example,~~ Current research indicates that: ~~Taking into consideration gender differences in adolescent development, it may be that boys share more intimate details when not in mixed company, thereby having better treatment outcomes. Parents also play an integral role in fostering self-efficacy in their children and they may need to get more involved, especially with their male teens. (Moore, Young, Weir, & Ochshorn, 2007, p. 142).~~

## Reference list – General notes

- Begin your reference list on a new page and title it 'References.' Centre the title on the page.
- Double-space your reference list and have a hanging indent.  
Hanging indent is where the first line of each reference is fully left justified while subsequent lines are indented to the right. The width of the hanging indent should be 5-7 spaces or 1.25 cm. Hanging indents and double spacing are set by the word processors.
- All of the references in the reference list must also be cited in the text.
- All references cited in text must also be included in the reference list (exceptions are unpublished items such as correspondence).
- List the references in alphabetical order by author surname/family name.
- Where there are two articles with the same authors and date order the references alphabetically by article title and add a letter suffix to the year of publication (e.g. 2003a, 2003b...).
- Provide organization names in full, unless they are obviously recognizable as abbreviations (e.g. APA for American Psychological Association).
- In an article, chapter or book title capitalize only the first word of the title and of the subtitle, if any, and any proper nouns. (Note: book titles should be italicized).
- In a periodical, journal, or serial title, give the title in full, in upper and lower case letters. The title should be italicized (e.g. Harvard Business Review).
- APA requires use of an en dash between pagination numbers. An en dash is longer and thinner than a hyphen. Type in an en dash, or if an en dash is unavailable on the keyboard, use a single hyphen. In either case there is no space before or after. We recommend consulting your faculty staff to determine their requirements.
- Check the reference details against the actual source - you are indicating that you have read a source when you cite it.
- Be consistent with your referencing style across the document.

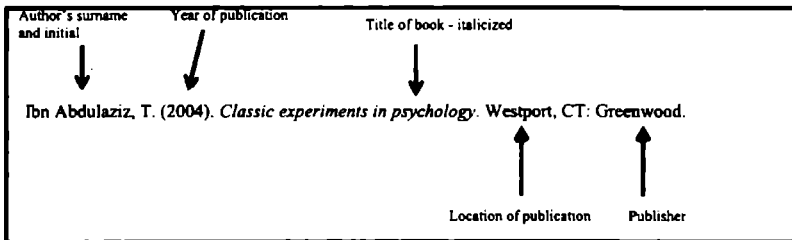

For this reference, Culver would be the primary source, and Jones would be the secondary source. You will name the primary source in your text, but the reference will credit the secondary source.

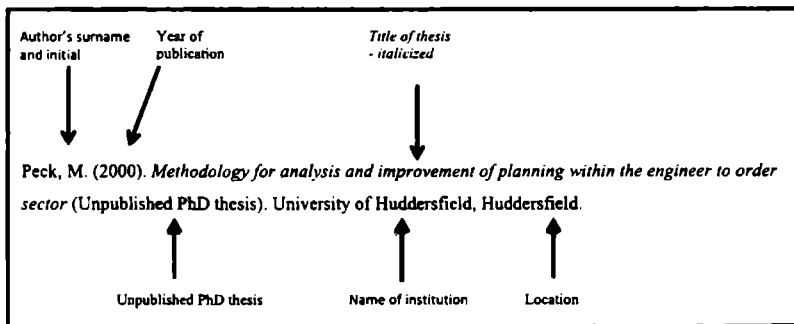

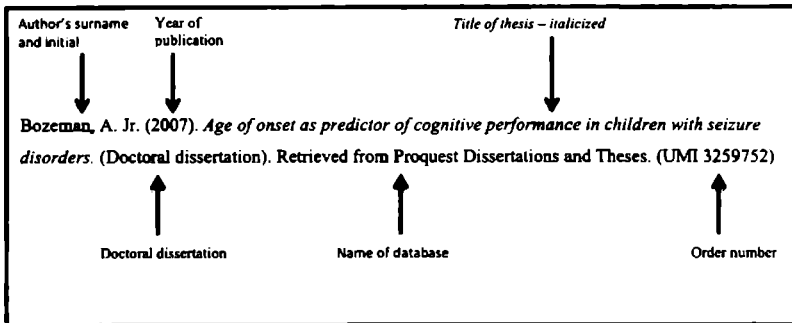

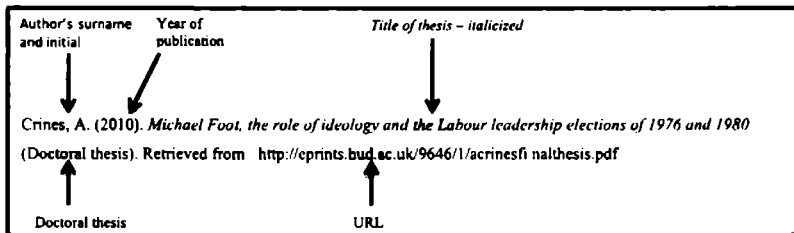

## Scholarly articles – General notes

- Follow these examples closely for all layouts, punctuation, spacing and capitalizing.
- There is no need to include the retrieval date.
- Do not write "p" before the page number.
- Do not write "vol" before the volume number but italicize the number.
- Include the issue number if it is available. Do not include the issue number for journals with continuous pagination (ie. the pagination of each issue, excluding the first issue, follows the pagination of the previous issue)
- Do not italicize the issue number but put it in brackets.
- Leave no space between volume and issue number.
- For electronic articles that do not have issue or page numbers an article number may be included if there is one. The DOI remains the primary identifier.



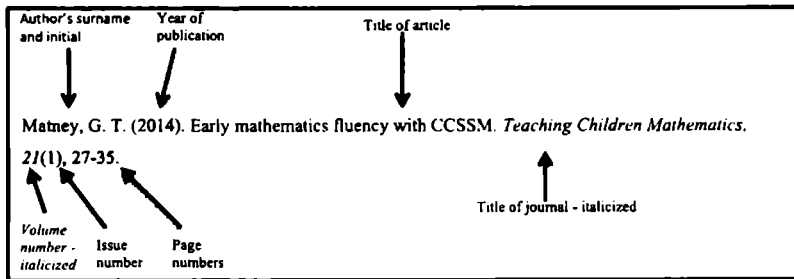

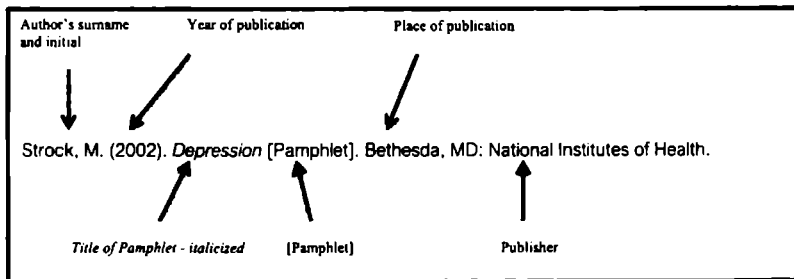
### **Pamphlet/ Brochure**

#### **General notes**

- Brochures or pamphlets are most often created by an organization. The full name of the organization begins the brochure or pamphlet reference followed by a period before the year.
- When there is missing information, use the following abbreviations: *N.P.* for "no place of publication," *n.p.* for "no publisher," and *n.d.* for "no date." Note that these abbreviations are NOT italicized in the reference list entry.
- You must include the [Brochure] or [pamphlet] in the reference.
- When the author of the brochure or pamphlet is also the publisher of the brochure which is most often the case (especially if a publisher is not clearly identified on the brochure or pamphlet), then write the word "Author" in the place of the publisher.

# **Chapter - Three**

## **Vancouver -Style Referencing Guidelines**

The Vancouver style originated in Vancouver, Canada, where members of the International Committee of Medical Journal Editors (ICMJE) agreed a system for presenting publications and citations. The US National Library of Medicine (NLM) produce the citation manual the ICMJE direct authors to, but the general rules of 'Vancouver style' have been adapted by individual institutions and publishers to meet their needs. Vancouver is a numeric system for citing sources in the text by giving a superscript number (1) to each source referred to. The full details of the source are provided in a reference list at the end, ordered numerically according to first appearance in the text (The university of york, 2012).

### **In-Text Citations**

The Vancouver Citation style uses the corresponding numbers from the Reference List at the end of the paper to document in-text citations. Multiple references can occur in one sentence, if necessary.

#### **Citing one work**

**Example:** Recent research<sup>(1)</sup> indicates that the number of duplicate papers being published is increasing.

#### **Citing more than one piece of work at the same time**

If you want to cite several pieces of work in the same sentence, you will need to include the citation number for each piece of work. A hyphen should be used to link numbers, which are inclusive, and a comma used where numbers are not consecutive.

**Example:** Several studies<sup>(6-9,13,15)</sup> have examined the effect of congestion charging in urban areas.

### **Citing the author's name in your text**

You can use the author's name in your text, but you must insert the citation number as well.

**Example:** As emphasized by Watkins <sup>(2 p.1)</sup> careers of diabetes sufferers "require perseverance and an understanding of humanity".

### **Citing more than one author's name in your text**

If a work has more than one author and you want to cite author names in your text, use 'et al' after the first author.

**Example:** Simons et al <sup>(3 p.4)</sup> state that the principle of effective stress is "imperfectly known and understood by many practicing engineers".

**Capitalization** should be only used for the first word in the title, proper nouns, and acronyms.
